INTRODUCTION

God is holy. This means that He is separate, or set apart, from all of creation. There is nothing else like Him in all of the universe and there is nothing that could ever compare to Him! He is complete and perfect in every way! God commanded His people to be "holy just as He is holy." God desires us to be holy because He desires for us to have perfect fellowship with Him. He is the giver of life and of every good thing. On our own, as sinners, we can never be holy, but God gave us His law to show us who He is and that we need Him. God's law shows us that it is only by His grace that we can be saved through the sacrifice of His Son Jesus on the cross for our sins.

OPENING ILLUSTRATION

Begin class by using the road signs provided in the lesson packet to lead the children in a discussion about how road signs give us instructions on how we should drive. Following the signs keeps us safe. They are the standard for how we should drive on the road. Hold up each sign and explain its purpose. Then, explain that God's law is like a road sign because it helps us know what God expects of us and shows us His standard for how to live holy or "set apart" for His purposes. Just like we don't always follow the road signs perfectly, we don't follow God's laws perfectly either because we are sinners. God gave us His law to show us that we need a Savior, and our Savior is Jesus!

STORY

Read Exodus 20:1-17. Use the Jesus Storybook Bible if you have it.

God gave His people the commandments as a gift, not to burden them, but to help them. In His great love for us, God has given us His law to show us that we are sinners in need of a Savior to rescue and free us from our sin. Without God's law, we would not know that we need Him!

No person is able to obey all of God's commands on their own strength, but with the power of Jesus, he or she can. When we have repented of our sin and placed our faith and trust in Jesus to forgive our sin, believing that His sacrifice on the cross was enough to pay our sin debt, we can live holy as God is holy! As God's people, we have a responsibility to obey God's commands and seek help from Him when we struggle. His Holy Spirit is always there to help us live for Him!

ACTIVITY

Use the matching game in the lesson packet to practice the meaning of the 10 commandments. Explain what each one means as you go. Play a few rounds as time allows.

PRAYER

Thank God that He gave His law as a gift to show us how much we need Him to be our rescue from sin. Ask God to help you trust Him and desire to keep His commands.

ACTIVITY

Use the coloring sheet in your take home packet to discuss the 10 commandments with your child. As they color, use the questions below to help facilitate discussion about why God gave us His law.

DISCUSSION

- What are the 10 Commandments? Can you name them all?
- Why did God give us commandments?
 God gave the 10 Commandments to Moses as a gift to show all people that we need a Savior who can rescue us from the bondage of sin. Jesus came to pay our sin debt, and by placing our faith and trust in Him, we can be forgiven.
- Can you follow all the commandments perfectly on your own?
 On our own, we desire sin. We cannot follow God's law and be holy as He is holy on our own strength.
 When we repent of our sin and trust Jesus for forgiveness of our sins, we are forgiven and the power of God's Holy Spirit helps us when we struggle to live holy and set apart.
- What does God want us to do when we mess up? Even as Christians, we mess up and sin. We live in a fallen world full of temptation and our sin nature still desires it sometimes. Until Jesus returns to restore the world and make all things new, we must rely on God to help us when we struggle. If we have placed our faith in Him, believing in His sacrifice for us on the cross, we remain children of God no matter what. He has paid for all sins past and present for those who believe, but we should still repent when we mess up. Then we can simply do better the next time by remembering the new life we've been given in Jesus.

PRAYER

Thank God that His commandments are a gift and not a burden. Thank Him that His commands show us how good and perfect He is and how much we need Him. Ask God to help you trust in Him more and desire to live holy as He is holy.
